
I. The <u>mistakes</u> of Moses.


Exodus 2:11-15 NLT ¹¹ Many years later, when Moses had grown up, he went out to visit his own people, the Hebrews, and he saw how hard they were forced to work. During his visit, he saw an Egyptian beating one of his fellow Hebrews. 12 After looking in all directions to make sure no one was watching, Moses killed the Egyptian and hid the body in the sand.


¹³ The next day, when Moses went out to visit his people again, he saw two Hebrew men fighting. "Why are you beating up your friend?" Moses said to the one who had started the fight.


14 The man replied, "Who appointed you to be our prince and judge? Are you going to kill me as you killed that Egyptian yesterday?"











Acts 7:23-25 NLT ²³ "One day when Moses was forty years old, he decided to visit his relatives, the people of Israel. ²⁴ He saw an Egyptian mistreating an Israelite. So Moses came to the man's defense and avenged him, killing the Egyptian. ²⁵ Moses assumed his fellow Israelites would realize that God had sent him to rescue them, but they didn't".

- I am not **good** enough.


Exodus 3:11-12 NLT

¹¹ But Moses protested to God, "Who am I to appear before Pharaoh? Who am I to lead the people of Israel out of Egypt?"



- I have no authority.

¹³ But Moses protested, "If I go to the people of Israel and tell them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' they will ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what should I tell them?"



- They will not **believe** me. Exodus 4:1-2 NLT But Moses protested again, "What if they won't believe me or listen to me? What if they say, 'The Lord never appeared to you'?" ²Then the Lord asked him, "What is that in your hand?"

- I don't <u>speak</u> well.

Exodus 4:10-12 NLT

¹⁰ But Moses pleaded with the Lord, "O Lord,
I'm not very good with words. I never have
been, and I'm not now, even though you have
spoken to me. I get tongue-tied, and my words
get tangled."

¹¹ Then the Lord asked Moses, "Who makes a person's mouth? Who decides whether people speak or do not speak, hear or do not hear, see or do not see? Is it not I, the Lord? 12 Now go! I will be with you as you speak, and I will instruct you in ... what to say."
