Matthew 5:13-16 NIV ¹³ "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot". ¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven". The qualities of our light. - Our light should be visible. Matthew 5:14b NIV A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Our light should be intentional and effective.
 Matthew 5:15 NIV
 ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house.

 Our light should be used to <u>illuminate</u> and expose.

Matthew 5:16a NIV ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others. Our lights should be <u>reflective</u>.
 Matthew 5:16b NIV
 That they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Salt and light both <u>give</u> of themselves.
Salt and light are distinctive.
