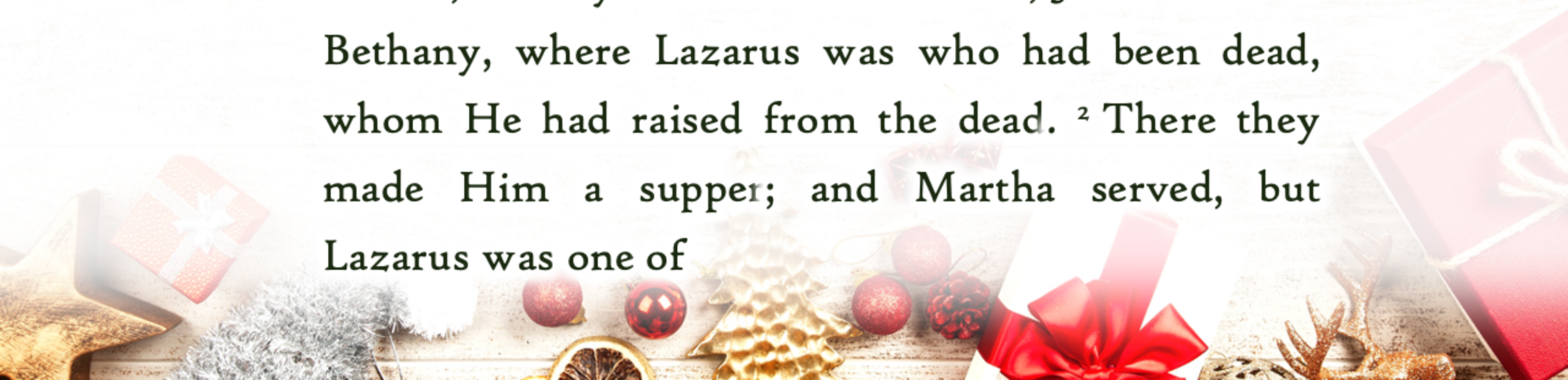
scoop out a handful of the flour moistened with oil,

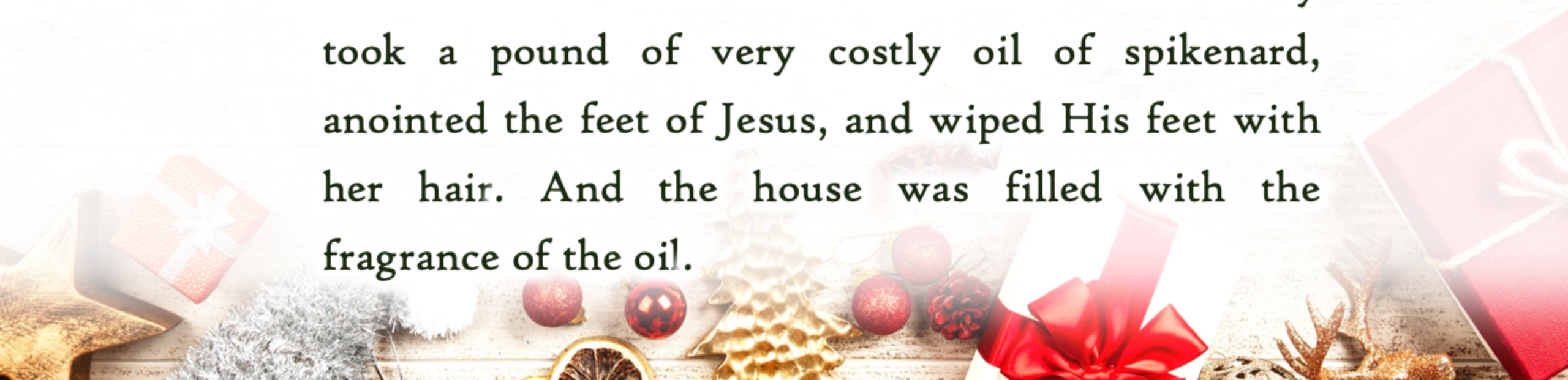
