




¹¹ The Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by."


¹¹ The Lord said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the Lord, for the Lord is about to pass by."

Moses was basically saying, I am not willing to sacrifice your **presence** for your **blessing**.






Deuteronomy 4:29 NLT
